The team members are Shelby Carlton, Hannah Scionti, Madyson Keim and Blair Buchanon. They will represent Florida at the National FFA Nursery and Landscape CDE in Indianapolis, Indiana "The event was challenging and consisted of identification practicums in which students had to identify 30 ornamental plants from a 100 plant list, 15 pests/disorders out of a 70 item list, and identify 15 tools out of a 100 item list. In addition to identification, there were four other events: Landscape Plan Interpretation, Pruning, Dealing with Hazardous Situations/Safety, and Equipment Maintenance," said Mr. Carlton.

Drifting with Boats!

On Friday March 3, 2017, attendees of the University of Central Florida's (UCF) annual *Initiatives in STEM – Florida Engineering Education Conference*, were treated to a presentation by KHS Science Teacher, Mr. George Bartuska and KHS Science Student, Mr. Tyler Chouquer. The conference showcased an array of speakers and subject-matter experts which included a panel of government/corporate STEM administrators, K-12 STEM educators, UCF STEM Professors and a series of interactive hands-on workshops.

Mr. Bartuska and Tyler's presentation "*From Student Ocean Current Drifters to Student Atmospheric Circulation Miniboats*" highlighted last year's "Student Ocean Drifter Project" involving the construction of ocean drifters by KHS students including Tyler, and the launching of those Drifters by the University of South Florida's - College of Marine Sciences staff while aboard USF's Oceanographic Vessel the *Weatherbird II*. Tyler explained the processes involved in the building and tracking of the drifters.



Additionally, Mr. Bartuska explained KHS students' new project for this year. It is a project involving a 4 foot sailboat (miniboat) that will soon be launched off the coast of North Carolina with an expected destination of the British Islands, possibly the coast of Ireland.

Both, last year's drifter project and this year's sailboat project contain GPS (global positioning system) transmitters/receivers to track the location of the drifters/sailboats. Mr. Bartuska shared with the conference attendees, a method he developed for teaching students through a hands-on laboratory procedure, about explaining how GPS works and where the satellites are in orbit.

Using a globe and some string, he demonstrated the differences in orbit elevations in outer space between the International Space Station (at about 250 miles up), Global Positioning Satellites or GPS (at about 12,000 miles up), and geostationary / geosynchronous Weather satellites (at about 22,300 miles up). Today, different kinds of satellites in space orbiting at different altitudes make up an integral part of scientist's research assets used for studying Earth's oceans and Earth's atmosphere.

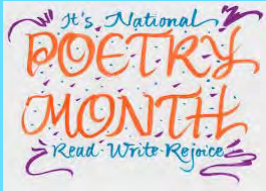


FFA—Sponsors Farm Day

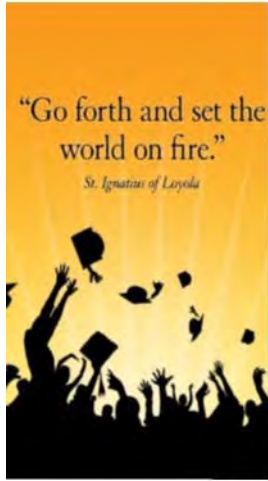
