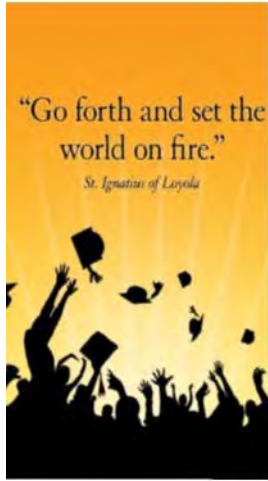

Chicken only had 84.9%, Wendy's Grilled Wrap had 88.4%, A&W's Chicken Grill Deluxe had 89.4%, and Tim Horton's Chipotle Chicken had 86.5% chicken.
