The U.S. Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) analyzes employee earnings data biennially according to education level. These findings indicate that workers with college degrees earn significantly more than those without; they also emphasize how lower education levels tend to correspond with higher unemployment rates. In 2015, adults with bachelor's degrees took home more than those with high school diplomas. **Degree holders earned \$48,500 a year, while diploma holders earned \$23,900.**

-- On average, a doctoral degree-holder will earn \$3.3 million over a lifetime, compared to \$2.3 million for a college graduate and \$1.3 million for those with a high school diploma.

-- People with less education in high-paying occupations can out-earn their counterparts with advanced degrees. But within the same industry, **workers with more schooling usually land better paychecks.**

We are very excited to let you know that we have just received approval and funding for an after school 2nd Quarter Credit Recovery Program from Title One! We will run the program in the Main Media Center and it will be open till 5:00 p.m. to allow students to have a place to work on credit recovery work and on their current 3rd quarter assignments to avoid being in the same position next quarter.

Teachers can send their credit recovery packet to Title One and the tutors will make copies for the students who come to after school credit recovery. 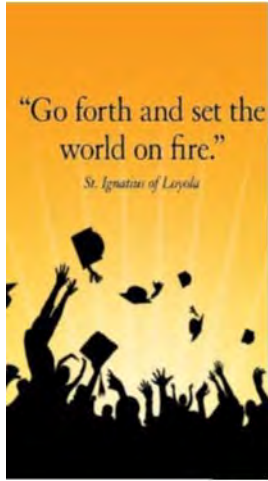
