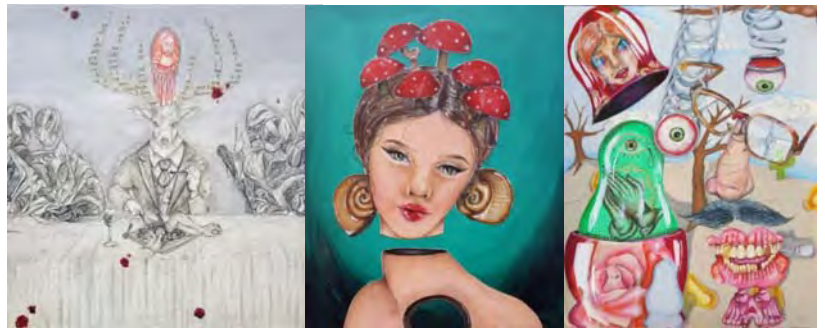

An essay describing their involvement with the ACE programs during their tenure at CFAA and how having the Top Gun Scholarship would help them in their continuing educational goals. The essay should be no longer than one page, 12 point font, Times New Roman font and include their name.

A second paper (not to exceed on page in length) including:

Unweighted GPA. ACT or SAT Scores, Volunteer Hours at ACE or SUN 'n FUN (not including the fly-in), Pilot status (applied for scholarship, accepted, soloed, or private pilot)

Any additional extra-curricular activities. The completed papers will need to be submitted electronically to museum@flvsnf.org Late applications will not be accepted.

After School 3rd Quarter Grade Recovery Program

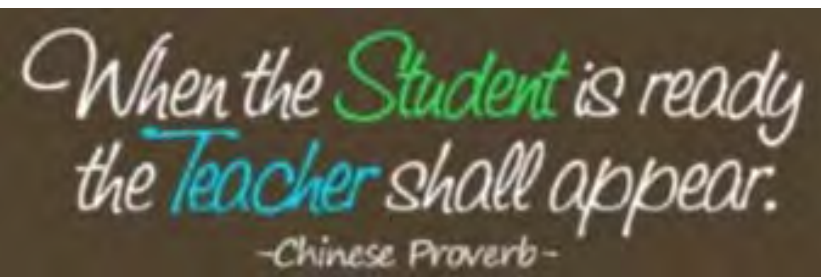


We are very excited to let you know that we have just received approval and funding to continue our after school Grade Recovery Program from Title One! We will run the program in the Main Media Center and it will be open till 5:00 p.m. to allow students to have a place to work on credit recovery work and on their current 3rd quarter assignments.

Teachers can send their credit recovery packet to Title One and the tutors will make copies for the students who come to after school credit recovery. We will collect the assignments and return the assignments for the teachers to grade. Teachers who want their students to just make up missing assignments from their gradebook also don't have to do anything except tell the Title One tutors and the missing assignments report will be provided to any and all students who show up for after

school credit recovery.

Our program after school is also not just for credit recovery. We will give students a place to work on their school work while they re waiting for their ride home, practice and/or any sports event. Parents, please encourage your child to come to the main media center any day from 2:00—5:00 for 3rd Quarter Recovery. We will be glad to help all students who attend.

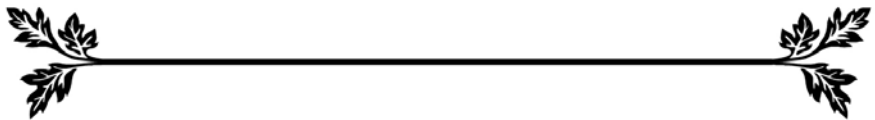

Notification to Parent Letter (Secondary Students)
Polk County Public Schools

Dear Parents of Middle and High School Students:

Polk County Public Schools is offering an exciting opportunity this summer for middle school and high school students to retake a course at their home school site in which they have not yet been successful and need to improve their grade or recover credit. Our Secondary Summer Program will be in operation Monday through Thursday, from June 12th through July 6, 2017. *School will be closed on July 4th, 2017.*

- Students may attend Session 1: Monday-Thursday, June 12 – 15 **and** Monday-Thursday, June 19 - 22 from 8:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. each day (5 hours per day for two weeks total).
- Students may attend Session 2: Monday-Thursday, June 26 – 29 **and** Monday-Thursday, July 3 – 6 (*students and teachers off on Tuesday, July 4th*) from 8:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. each day (5 hours per day for two weeks total).
- Students taking Algebra I for credit recovery must attend both sessions daily (4 weeks total).

Complete and return to your school's guidance office the attached *Student Registration* by **June 3, 2017**.

- Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis at the secondary school sites with priority given to seniors, then juniors, then sophomores, then freshmen (students from Davenport SOTA, Lawton Chiles, Union Academy, Jewett SOTA, and Jewett Middle Academy who need middle grade course recovery may register at one of the other 22 middle school sites offering summer programs).
- School bus transportation to summer credit recovery is not provided. Students may come to school on their own, with parents, or utilizing the COLTS transit bus universal access agreement. Students will need to register for the COLTS program as outlined in the Transportation Information Guide.

Important Note on Secondary Summer Course/Credit Recovery attendance policy: Middle and high school students enrolled in secondary Course/Credit Recovery may be absent from the school site up to a total of three (3) days beginning June 12, 2017. On the fourth (4th) day of absence from the program prior to successful, verified completion of the credit at level of "C" or higher, the student's participation in the 2017 Secondary Summer Course/Credit Recovery is terminated. *Please also be advised that repeated misconduct that results in disciplinary action as per the Student Code of Conduct may result in dismissal from summer school.*

We do hope that you will consider applying for our Secondary Summer Course/Credit Recovery Program. It is a unique opportunity for your student to retake an unsuccessful course and move forward in their educational journey.
