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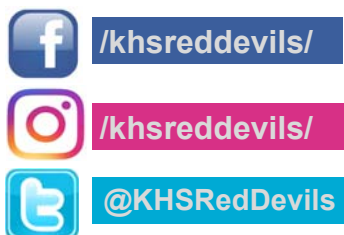

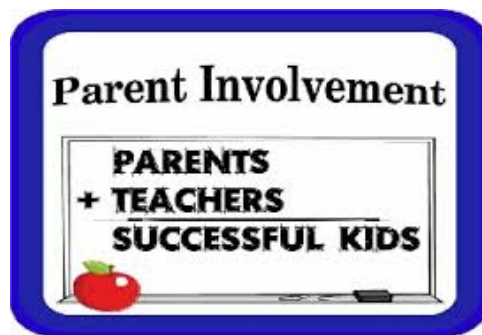

## National Birth Defects Awareness Month

National Birth Defect Support and Prevention Month is during the month of January and is recognized all over the world raise awareness of birth defects, their causes, and their impact on the mothers and their children.

According to the CDC, 1 in 33 babies born in the U.S. suffers from some birth defect and is the leading cause of deaths amongst

infants. ## CELIAC AWARENESS MONTH

**Celiac Awareness Month is in May.** Celiac is an autoimmune disease where your immune system damages the intestines as a result of ingesting gluten.

**Celiac disease** is a disease anyone at any age can get and is caused by the body attacking the small intestines after ingesting gluten. Gluten is a protein found in wheat, rye, and barley. For children and adults, the

symptoms are different with children being more likely to to have joint pain, anemia and more problems. According to the celiac disease foundation, adults have issues long term due to their prolonged exposure. Their issues can include the development of other autoimmune disorders like Type I diabetes and multiple sclerosis (MS), dermatitis herpetiformis (an itchy skin rash), anemia, osteoporosis, infertility and miscarriage, neurological conditions like epilepsy and migraines, short stature, and intestinal cancers. Celiac can also be hereditary. If a parent has it, the child has a 1 in 10 chance of developing it. The age with the highest percentage for developing Celiac disease is those over 20 years old. The only treatment for Celiac disease is going on a strict gluten-free diet for the rest of their lives, and to take medicine if needed to treat the symptoms or long term exposure results.

Supporting someone with Celiac disease can seem kinda of hard. You have to be sensitive when it comes to what they eat or where they can eat. More companies and restaurants are coming out with more gluten-free foods, so people with Celiac disease can makes foods that they can eat with everyone else instead of making two different meals. The best support to give to someone with Celiac disease is emotional support that's why Celiac Awareness month is in May. They have events and foods to show support the ones who feel alone in it.

# Scholarships for Minority Students Interested in STEAM

Minorities and women make up a small percentage of the science, engineering and architectural workforce. Let's change this! Here are some of the best STEAM scholarships available to students looking to pursue degrees in these fields. Share these with your students, parents, and fellow educators. Together, we can encourage and diversify the next generation of architects, engineers, creators, and innovators.

## 1. For students interested in architecture

The Diversity Advancement Scholarship, a multi-year scholarship of up to \$20,000, helps minority students pursue successful careers in architecture. The Diversity Advancement Scholarship supports undergraduate minority students who are entering, enrolled in, or transferring into a National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB)-accredited undergraduate architecture degree program.

### Eligible students must:

- Be US citizens.
- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA.
- Apply for federal student aid.
- Be high school students planning to enroll in an NAAB-accredited architecture degree program or be rising second-year college students in an NAAB-accredited architecture degree program.

Apply by January 17, 2018 and you could receive up to \$20,000! [Apply online at architectsfoundation.org/scholarships](http://architectsfoundation.org/scholarships).

### Application deadline: January 17, 2018

What to expect when applying: Students will need to provide diversity information related to gender, race, and age; school information, including GPA, transcripts, and all NAAB-accredited programs applied for; financial information, such as estimated college expenses and other sources of financial support; a personal essay related to architecture; a résumé, including extracurricular activities and work history; two letters of recommendation; and two samples of creative work (sketches, photographs, sculptures, etc.).

## 2. For women who are interested in engineering

Try the Society of Women Engineers Scholarships. You'll find a variety of one-time and renewable scholarships offered to incoming freshman women pursuing a degree in engineering.

### Eligible students must:

- Be women.
- Be US citizens or permanent residents of the United States.
- Have a minimum unweighted GPA of 3.5.
- Apply for federal student aid.
- Be full-time students, except for reentry and nontraditional applicants.

### Application deadline: May 1, 2018

What to expect when applying: Students will need to provide transcripts; an acceptance letter from a college or university indicating acceptance into an Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET)-accredited engineering or computer science program for the upcoming academic year; a résumé; one letter of recommendation from a STEM teacher; and one letter of recommendation from an individual who knows the student well but is not a relative.

## 3. For students into technology

The Blacks at Microsoft Scholarship is a renewable \$5,000 scholarship for outstanding black high school seniors who are interested in pursuing careers in technology.

### Eligible students must:

- Be a high school senior of African descent.
- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.3 or higher.
- Apply for federal student aid.
- Plan to attend a four-year college or university in the fall of the year following high school graduation.
- Pursue a bachelor's degree in engineering, computer science, computer information systems, or select business programs (such as finance, business administration, or marketing).
- Show a passion for technology and leadership at school or in the community.

### Application deadline: March 1, 2018

What to expect when applying: Students will need to provide demographic information; school information including GPA and transcripts; two letters of recommendation; a résumé including work experience, extracurricular activities, and awards; a photo; and two essays.
